Dianne Reeves

Five-time Grammy winner DIANNE REEVES is the pre-eminent jazz vocalist in the world. As a result of her breathtaking virtuosity, improvisational prowess, and unique jazz and R&B stylings, Reeves received the Grammy for Best Jazz Vocal Performance for three consecutive recordings – a Grammy first in any vocal category.

Featured in George Clooney's six-time Academy Award nominated Good Night, and Good Luck, Reeves won the Best Jazz Vocal Grammy for the film's soundtrack. Reeves has recorded and performed with Wynton Marsalis and the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra. She has also recorded with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra conducted by Daniel Barenboim and was a featured soloist with Sir Simon Rattle and the Berlin Philharmonic. Reeves was the first Creative Chair for Jazz for the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the first vocalist to ever perform at the famed Walt Disney Concert Hall.

Reeves worked with legendary producer Arif Mardin (Norah Jones, Aretha Franklin) on the Grammy winning A Little Moonlight, an intimate collection of standards featuring her touring trio. When Reeves' holiday collection Christmas Time is Here was released, Ben Ratliff of The New York Times raved, "Ms. Reeves, a jazz singer of frequently astonishing skill, takes the assignment seriously; this is one of the best jazz Christmas CD's I've heard."

In recent years Reeves has toured the world in a variety of contexts including "Sing the Truth," a musical celebration of Nina Simone which also featured Lizz Wright and Angelique Kidjo. She performed at the White House on multiple occasions including President Obama's State Dinner for the President of China as well as the Governors' Ball.

Reeves' most recent release Beautiful Life, features Gregory Porter, Robert Glasper, Lalah Hathaway and Esperanza Spalding. Produced by Terri Lyne Carrington, Beautiful

Life won the 2015 Grammy for Best Jazz Vocal Performance. Reeves is the recipient of honorary doctorates from the Berklee College of Music and the Juilliard School. In 2018 the National Endowment for the Arts designated Reeves a Jazz Master – the highest honor the United States bestows on jazz artists.

## JOLENE BUTTS-FREEMAN

Jolene Butts Freeman is a native Atlantan. She was born in East Point, Georgia and was raised in Southwest Atlanta. She attended Benjamin E. Mays High School and graduated with honors in the top 10 percent of her class. After graduating from Mays, Jolene attended Clark Atlanta University where she received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Journalism/ Communications.

She went on to further her education at Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism where she earned her Masters Degree in Broadcast Journalism in the accelerated one year program. Jolene was the first in her class to land a job in the broadcast television industry. She got her start as a general assignment reporter in Albany, Georgia at WALB-TV.

Like most journalists, Jolene continued to gain experience and move up the ranks in the industry. She worked as a video journalist at CNN, assistant producer, general assignment reporter and news anchor at WAPT-TV in Jackson, and Meridian, Mississippi and FOX 24 News in Macon, Georgia. She landed her dream job as a television reporter at WSB-TV where she became an Emmy Award winning journalist for a story she covered called "Yerkes Protest". Additionally, she worked as a television reporter for CBS 46 in Atlanta.

Jolene also has experience in education. She has worked and continues to serve as an adjunct professor at Clark Atlanta University where she teaches media courses and shares her "Real World Media Experiences" with her students in the Clark Atlanta Mass Media Arts Department.

She transitioned from broadcast television into the world of public information and media relations. Jolene served as the official spokesperson and Public Information Officer for several public safety agencies including the DeKalb County Sheriff's Office and the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department where she worked with mayors, elected officials, and executive leadership. While employed for these agencies, Jolene has successfully handled large media crises in Metropolitan Atlanta, and has conducted media training for public safety employees in an effort to teach them the dos and don'ts of emergency communications. She worked for Fulton County Government as a communications manger for more than 12 years handling communications efforts to include everything from writing, developing annual reports, video producing, show hosting, and social media. These experiences have lead Jolene to accomplish yet another life's goal as she has recently been named the Associate Vice President of communications and Media Relations at Clark Atlanta University.

Jolene has won numerous awards for her work in communications and public information from both the National Association of County Information Officers and the International Association of Business Communicators. She uses her vast media background as well as her skills as a professional photographer to tackle projects that have lead to her winning such awards. She is active in several organizations including; Clark Atlanta University Mass Media Arts Alumni Society and Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated where she is a member of the Kappa Omega Chapter and serves as the chapter's vice president.

She is the mother of two beautiful children, Jazmine Rachel Freeman and Jerry Emanuel Freeman "Tripp", both of whom attend Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Jolene considers her kids to be her biggest accomplishment in life.

## DEBB MOORE

Debb Moore is a trusted, creative veteran radio host who has cherished the opportunity to assist in fostering the sounds of America's only indigenous art form – Jazz! During her broadcast career, she has produced and hosted popular Jazz programs heard throughout metro Atlanta and worldwide via the internet – always hoping at least one new set of ears joins the musical caravan and are able to perceive and enjoy the rich and vast history and sound of what is known affectionately as Americas' Classical Music – Jazz!

Debb has become known for her prepared, articulate, insightful, candid, humorous, and hard-to-get interviews with some of the world's greatest artistic voices and most talked about talents in all genres of entertainment. They include trailblazers such as world-renowned photographer Gordon Parks, Jazz saxophone legend Sonny Rollins, the multitalented Wynton Marsalis, the mesmerizing storyteller Abbey Lincoln, music impresario Quincy Jones, award-winning actresses Ruby Dee, Angela Bassett, Public Television host Tavis Smiley and producer/director Julie Dash – to name only a few. Recently, she produced and facilitated a riveting panel conversation with 3 National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) Jazz masters – DeDe Bridgewater, Dianne Reeves, and Terri Lynne Carrington, for the inaugural Jazz Music Awards show. Listening to one of her broadcasts/interviews have often been described as "soothing and inviting as if sitting across the kitchen table sipping a cup of tea with your favorite person."

Debb also taught a daylong workshop during the 2006 National Black Arts Festival, holding down the attention of excited festival goers during the class titled "Jazz Music is What I Want 2 Know," it was attended by multi-generational gender ethnicities and celebrities in town for festival activities! Debb has produced several national programs including "Four Divas of Jazz," spotlighting the storied lives and careers of Ella Fitzgerald, Carmen McCrae, Billie Holiday, and Sarah Vaughan, the weeklong Duke Ellington centennial "Duke @ 100" and Louis Armstrong titled "Looking @ Louis," and most recently "On The Sonny Side of Harlem" (2018), all of which drew rave reviews from an enthusiastic world audience! Debb has not limited her broadcasting skills to only radio but has hosted television shows and has moderated several Jazz Times magazine convention panels and has served as a moderator/panelist with the International Association of Jazz Educators (IAJE) conferences. Debb continues to explore and expand her broadcasting prowess as a voice–over artist and looks forward to doing movie animation, documentaries, and commercials.

Debb graduated from Clark College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Broadcast Journalism. She is also a soror of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority. Debb is a former Miss Black Atlanta and an Atlanta City Council legislative aide where she worked tirelessly with the community. Debb also visits local elementary and middle schools and

encourages children to embrace and live multidimensional lives by understanding and developing their interest in music, art, and culture and learning to become critical thinkers so they can grow to become productive, contributing, and engaged members of society.
